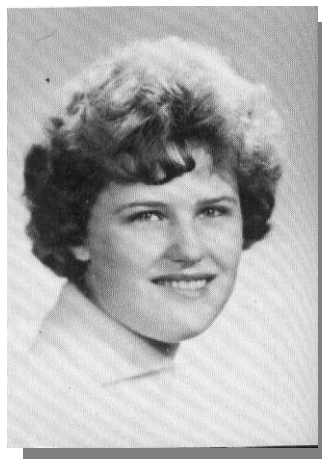

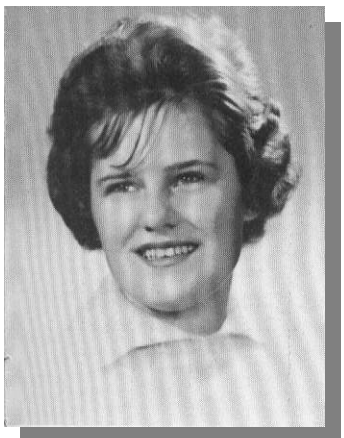

Longtime resident of Manchester and Concord, died Wednesday, April 14, 2010.

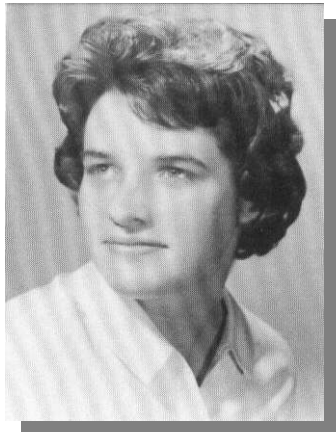
She was born Jan. 9, 1944. She retired after a successful business career.

Hi Everyone!

My life has changed significantly! In April of 2016 I finally was able to sell my consulting business in California but was tied to a transfer clause where I would be an employee of the new company for a 2 year transition period - essentially slavery! At the end of April 2018 I finally was able to transition out/retire. I still spend a few hours a month consulting on an individual basis for a project in Santa Cruz, CA that will be a 27K sf net zero energy building for a non-profit insurance company. It is under construction and is expected to be complete in Jan 2020 or sooner.

To move to Washington State we looked at about 5 properties in Clark County WA - just north of Portland, OR - that we made offers on and withdrew or they decided they didn't like our offer. Finally, in Feb of 2017 we purchased the property in Battle Ground - a 10 acre parcel with a large home with 3 bedroom suites and an apartment - which we eventually hope to have for a caregiver - we are all getting older. 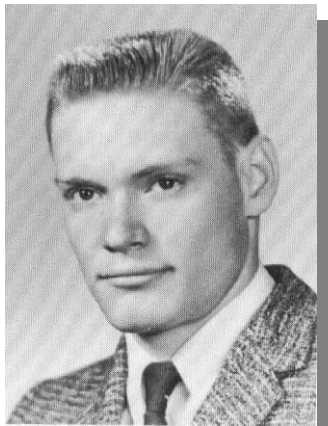

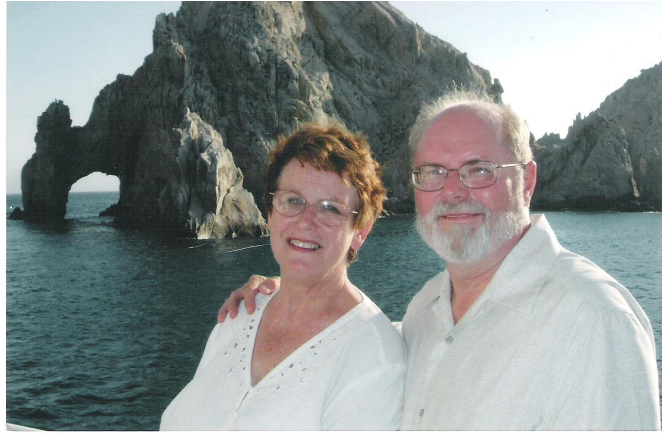
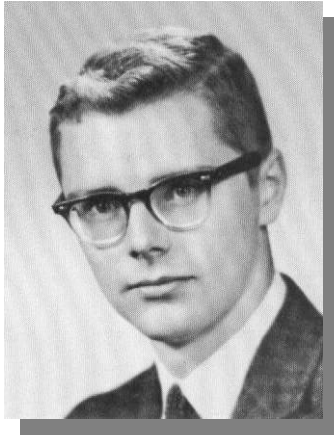

After graduation, I attended Oberlin College (Doc. Blanchard's alma mater) graduating in 1966 with a B.M. in Bassoon Performance. I then played 3 years in the New Orleans Symphony where I met my wife, Kathleen Kella a violinist.

We were married in 1969 and have since played together in The Louisville Orchestra (KY), the Honolulu Symphony (Hawaii and Kathy's home town), the Orquesta Nacional de Mexico (Mexico City, Mexico), the Minnesota Orchestra (Minneapolis), the Detroit Symphony, and Michigan Opera Theatre.

In 1992, I began working as Technical Supervisor for the Michigan Piano Company working on the rebuilding and restoration of fine older pianos. I pursued this as well the orchestral performance with the bassoon until recently.

Obituary:

Kirkland David Ferris, of Southfield, Michigan, passed away Saturday, April 10, 2021 after a courageous battle with ALS. He was born December 30, 1943 in Hartford, Connecticut to Elizabeth and Walter Ferris.

Mr. Ferris received his Bachelor's Degree from Oberlin Conservatory In Oberlin, Ohio. He later obtained his Master's Degree in Music History at the University of Michigan. Mr. Ferris was a Bassoonist with the Detroit Symphony, then Principal Bassoon with the Michigan Opera Theatre for almost 30 years. He developed a piano service, including re-building, re-finishing and tuning.

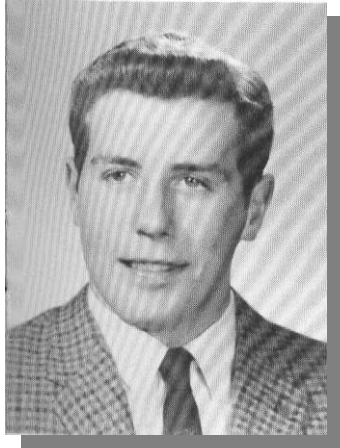
He greatly enjoyed cycling and was an avid follower of the Tour de France and the other major European cycling tours. As a youth in New Hampshire, Kirk loved working on classic cars. At 17 he rebuilt a period steam engine to install in his boat.

Kirkland is survived by his beloved wife of 52 years, Kathleen; son, Jonathan, daughter-in-law Jeannette Ferris; daughter, Kristen Ferris; grandchildren, Gabrielle, Norah, and Samantha Ferris; sister, Gail McFarland; and Niece Eryn Sepp."

I, classmate, Dr. Roderick (Rod) E Prior, have stayed in touch with Kirk more or less since we were in the 9th grades. We played music together in high school, Kirk on bassoon and me on clarinet. We were fortunate enough to play in the New Hampshire Symphony the last two years of high school, and by happenstance spent the summer of 1967 at Dartmouth, Kirk in the Dartmouth summer music festival and me doing research at Dartmouth Med School where I was a student.

Kirk graduated from Oberlin and went right to the New Orleans Symphony, playing second bassoon. He then moved to the St. Louis Symphony, the Honolulu Symphony, the National Symphony of Mexico, The Minnesota Orchestra, and the Detroit Symphony. He played professionally until he started suffering from amyotrophic lateral sclerosis in the late 1990's, when he could no longer play the bassoon. He then worked as a piano technician for some years and taught bassoon and bassoon reed making until he was forced by retire because of slowly advancing ALS. He lived with ALS much longer than the usual case and became the longest living ALS patient of the University of Michigan neurologists who cared for him.

Kirk never lost his intellect, his humor and his smile. I will miss him greatly.
