



Concord, NH – Jeffrey E. Parmenter, 76, of Concord, passed away at his residence on Friday, June 11, 2021.


Born on September 20, 1944 in Hanover, NH, he was the son of the late Robert and Eleanor (Patten) Parmenter.


The family expressed their deep gratitude to the staff of Concord Hospital and Riverbend Elder Services for their continued support and care of Lurlyne over the years.



Besides her husband, Richard, she is survived by a brother and sister-in-law, Philip & Lisa Popkin; and many nieces & nephews.





After a number of years, a career change took me in the direction of raising money for charities. Among other places, I worked at the New York Blood Center and Goodwill Industries of Greater New York.


